CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

AIM OF THE DEASA CONFERENCE

The DEASA Conference aims to champion the discourse in ODeL, embracing innovation and technological trends, such as artificial intelligence, by bringing together ODeL practitioners, leading academics, researchers and research scholars, consultants, industry players, policy makers, among others, to share knowledge, experiences, research findings and best practices to strengthen collaborative efforts in maintaining quality distance education design and delivery. It also provides a platform for delegates to present and deliberate on practical challenges, and explore opportunities for education transformation through ODeL. Local hosts are the Malawi College of Distance Education, under the ODeL Directorate of the Ministry of Education, and the Open and Distance Education Association of Malawi (ODEAMA).

SUB-THEMES

A. ODeL, a catalyst for economic viability, global collaboration and job market readiness

This sub-theme focuses on examining affordability and flexibility of ODeL in providing pathways to an enhanced global collaboration, employability and entrepreneurship, contributions to sustainable economic development, preparing students for the evolving global job market and an opportunity to solve emerging industrial, national and global challenges.

B. Widening access, equity and inclusion through community engagement in lifelong learning

Papers under this sub-theme should discuss the role of ODeL in increasing access and promoting equity and inclusion through community engagement in lifelong learning that includes, but not limited to Continuous Professional Development as key to building resilient communities and achieving sustainable development goals. Papers can also position ODeL as a pathway that removes barriers in accessing education among the marginalized.

C. Re-aligning education governance systems to comprehensively embrace distance education

Authors contributing to this sub-theme should focus on analyzing policy frameworks, regulations, and governance structures that support the adoption and establishment of ODeL in dual mode institutions and at national and regional levels to promote sustainable development. Addressing recurrent issues of funding, staffing and infrastructural development for an effective ODeL system.

D. Student Support Services in Distance Education: Current Trends

The subtheme covers student support in ODeL in general, highlighting personal, academic, administrative support while focusing on good practices and emerging issues.

E. Innovative pedagogies and Instructional Material Development in Distance Education

This sub theme covers ODeL pedagogies and Instructional Materials designing and development processes, Developers incentives, policies, guidelines...

F. Evidence-based ODeL practices

This sub-theme explores the intersection of evidence generated from research on ODeL and how ODeL is implemented in practice. For ODeL to contribute to a sustainable future, it has to build upon evidence.

G. Artificial intelligence and ODeL transformation power

The authors will explore emerging trends in AI as used to enhance ODeL.
